Professional Activities of Staff

- Program of Studies Redesign
 - Principal, Career Tech Director, and Dean 9-10, and Dean 11-12 are collaboratively working to update both the format and content in the KHS Program of Studies.
 - KHS Department Heads are working collaboratively to revise course descriptions, as well as support a shift in scope and sequence of classes to make for a more connected student experience
 - Program of Studies is going through a redesign to create a streamlined document that will be user friendly and interactive
- KHS and WMCC Partnership
 - Continued meetings are occurring with WMCC, KHS, and the SAU 9 office. WMCC president Chuck Lloyd and Vice President Kristen Miller met with KHS Principal and SAU 9 Superintendent about this partnership
 - Targeting a WMCC college course to be taught onsite at KHS and available to all KHS students to earn credit at both Kennett High School and through WMCC.
 - Ongoing meetings are occurring with White Mountain Community College to enhance our collaboration to offer increased opportunities to students to gain early access to college through running start, dual enrollment, E-start, and other means to provide as many possible opportunities for students at KHS in all academic areas
