Professional Activities of Staff

- Program of Studies Redesign
 - Principal, Career Tech Director, and Dean 9-10, and Dean 11-12 are collaboratively working to update both the format and content in the KHS Program of studies.
 - Program of studies is going through a redesign to create a streamlined document that will be user friendly and interactive
 - Work on scope and sequence of programming to fit the 9-10 and 11-12 grade-span model to help create pathways that will drive student choice and success
- Science
 - Physical Science- Rocket Project
 - Students in physical science classes with both Mrs. Sargent and Mrs. Frankel:
 - Researched and designed paper rockets that would travel a maximum distance at a specific angle
 - Design an investigation to determine the optimum angle for distance
 - Redesign based on initial investigation
 - Comply with a preset budget for material and determine distance related to cost as well as overall distance and angle of launch
 - Biology- Students in biology class attended a presentation during flex on Kidney Dialysis. The guest speakers were Todd Diadone and Jason Pettengill from FRESENEUS.
 - Students learned about systems and models, cell physiology and homeostasis, negative feedback mechanisms, as well as career paths and opportunities in this field of science.
