## **Professional Activities of Staff**

- KHS Universal Team
  - December 8, 2023 will be our first ever student run whole school meeting. Students will be facilitating this meeting as we look to transition school and class meetings to become student led. Collaboration is occurring between student council and student ambassadors, as well as bringing in our other student clubs
  - Quarter 2 will focus on Ownership, which is the O in SOAR. Students will be running the school meeting as well as looking at leading positive cheer during winter sports.
  - Continued work is being pursued to look at how to improve the physical space in the cafeteria to make it feel more welcoming to students. Staff and students visited another school and are brainstorming ideas for the space
- ALICE Training- all new staff participated in ALICE training facilitated by Chief Mattei, as well as any staff that wanted a refresher.
  - Classroom trainings with staff and students will be the next step in November and beyond
- IM Math Training
  - The next IM training will be the week after Thanksgiving, where teachers will be observing our own teachers implementing IM lessons and then work collaboratively to provide feedback. This will be followed by completing similar rounds specifically in the high school
- Outdoor Recreation (Career Tech Program)- Offered a Wilderness First Aid and CPR. This was opened up to all students, not just members of the class or Career Tech Center.
